- **Children's Medical Center Dallas:** an academic medical center campus anchored by a 400-bed, full-service hospital, including the only pediatric Level I Trauma Center in North Texas.
- **Children's Medical Center Plano:** a 72-bed, full-service hospital with two specialty centers, including the Children's Health Andrews Institute for Orthopaedics & Sports Medicine; a new hospital tower to ultimately add 140 beds.

- **Behavioral health:** robust outpatient services, plus a sizable investment in up to 100 inpatient pediatric beds for children and adolescents at the future Texas Behavioral Health Center at UT Southwestern.

- **Cancer and blood disorders:** the only National Cancer Institute (NCI)-designated cancer center in North Texas.

continuing our excellence, preparing for tomorrow

In 2024, Children's Health and UT Southwestern together announced plans to build a new, transformative \$5 billion campus to replace the existing Children's Medical Center Dallas. The new campus will be one of the largest pediatric hospitals in the nation and will be a hub of research, education and innovation. It will include 4.5 million square feet of construction, three new towers and 552 beds.
