

Children's Medical Center Dallas PGY2 Pediatric Pharmacy Residency



PROGRAM PURPOSE

The PGY-2 pharmacy residency program build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY-1 pharmacy residency training to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. The experience of a PGY-2 residency provides residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY-2 pharmacy residency are qualified to practice in clinical patient care areas or academia, and are eligible for board certification, if available.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must be graduates of an American Council on Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) accredited degree program (or one in the process of pursuing accreditation) or have a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Committee (FPGEC) certificate from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). Applicants must also be eligible for licensure in the state of Texas.

Applicants must have successfully completed a Pharmacy Practice PGY1 residency. Children's Medical Center Pediatric Pharmacy Residency Program (PGY2) uses the Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS) for all required materials. Candidate selection is based on evaluation of documents submitted in PhORCAS and phone/video/on-site interview(s). A pre-employment screening process will follow the receipt of your application and may include a criminal background check, verification of prior employment, drug screen, physical, and evidence of authorization to work in the United States.

Applicants must submit the following documents via PhORCAS by January 2, 2024:

- 1. One-page letter of intent
- 2. Curriculum vitae
- 3. Three (3) letters of recommendation
- 4. Official transcript from pharmacy school

Additionally, all applicants must complete a Pharmacy Resident job application at jobsearch.childrens.com.
