PROGRAM **PURPOSE**

The PGY1 pharmacy residency at Children's Medical Center builds on Doctor of Pharmacy education to provide an environment for accelerated growth under the guidance of experienced practitioners. Residents are responsible for managing and improving medication-use processes, providing evidence-based and patient-centered medication therapy management, providing education, and demonstrating leadership and time management skills. PGY1 pharmacy residency graduates will be prepared to practice as clinical pharmacists or seek postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

APPLICATION PROCESS

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Applicants must be graduates or candidates for graduation of an American Council on Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) accredited degree program (or one in the process of pursuing accreditation) or have a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Committee (FPGEC) certificate from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). Applicants must also be eligible for licensure in the state of Texas.

Children's Medical Center Pediatric Pharmacy Residency Program (PGY1) uses the Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS) for all required materials. Candidate selection is based on evaluation of documents submitted in PhORCAS and phone/on-site interview(s). A preemployment screening process will follow the receipt of your application and may include a criminal background check, verification of prior employment, drug screen, physical, and evidence of authorization to work in the United States.

Applicants must submit the following documents via PhORCAS by January 2, 2024:

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- 1. One-page letter of intent
- 2. Curriculum vitae
- 3. Three (3) letters of recommendation
- 4. Official transcript from pharmacy school

Additionally, all applicants must complete a Pharmacy Resident job application at jobsearch.childrens.com.
