Infectious Diseases Inpatient Consult Service: Gained exposure to a wide spectrum of infectious diseases in hospitalized patients, sharpened exposure history taking skills, recommended and followed up on a variety of diagnostic modalities, proposed treatment options, duration, and follow-up. Presented at weekly ID conference meetings.

Ambulatory Infectious Diseases Clinic: Followed patients in an outpatient clinic setting for post-discharge care and monitoring. Spent time in dedicated HIV clinic following disease markers and medications.

Research: Dedicated time to scholarly research projects with guidance of infectious disease faculty. Included time for IRB proposal submission, review of electronic medical records, analysis of data, development of poster presentation, and write-up of findings for submission.
